Where many moving companies have fallen by the wayside over the years, Liberty Moving & Storage has persevered by staying true to its core values. Here is a snapshot of our journey to our position as the leading moving and storage company in New York:

A Snapshot of Our History

1939- While working as a delivery man at a local appliance store, Michael Federico's customers express the need for a dependable moving company. With one truck and two helpers, he concentrates on becoming a reliable household mover for local residents. Liberty Moving & Storage is started on Liberty Ave. in Jamaica, NY.

1965- After returning home from the Army, **Michael Federico Jr.** joins Liberty Moving and Storage at the age of 21. He starts out helping his father as a driver and quickly learns the diverse aspects of successful moving.

1973- Michael Federico becomes President of Liberty Moving & Storage. With the help of Treasurer and partner Thomas Aleo, Liberty embarks on a growth phase that takes the company from 8 employees to 100 employees.

1975- Liberty Moving & Storage becomes an agent for Allied Van Lines, the #1 Van Lines in the country at the time.

1988- Michael Federico's two sons, **Michael III** and **Anthony**, join Liberty Moving & Storage. They start out loading trucks and working in the warehouse. As did their father and grandfather, they learn the moving business from the ground up.

1996- Liberty is named the largest household booking agent for Allied Van Lines.

1999- Michael Federico III is appointed Vice President of Commercial Sales. Anthony Federico is appointed Vice President of Household Sales and National Accounts. The two are responsible for a second major growth phase that doubles the volume and the number employees at the company.

2001- After 25 years as a successful Allied agent, Liberty Moving & Storage changes its affiliation to **United Van Lines**, the # 1 van line in the country today.

2005- Liberty Moving & Storage is named the largest household booking agent out of 650 agents at United Van Lines.
